



Year 13 Psychology Curriculum Map

Aims and Rationale: Students have a concrete idea of their current level of attainment, predicted grades, targets and strategies from the end of year 12 exam. Over the summer students will have reviewed the introduction into Forensics and will use this as a springboard to build on. There is a key visit from Dr. Guy Sutton involving a brain dissection which occurs in the Autumn term (2) to compliment students' study of Biopsych and Forensics. Research methods revision is completed alongside topic work and the mathematical content is taught as a block in Autumn 2. The whole year 13 curriculum is taught by the end of February, ready for revision and consolidation. Spring 2 and Summer 1 are spent engaged in extensive revision, retention and consolidation activities in preparation for the A level examinations.
